From the Pastor's Desk



Greetings in the Name of our Faithful and Powerful God.

For our Lenten journey this year, we will be focusing on Ephesians 1 and how God has chosen us and blessed us, and what that causes in us. We will also be looking at the death and resurrection accounts of the gospels.

For our Sunday journey, we will be looking at Ephesians 1, verses 3 through 14. This passage from Paul is central to our salvation and the basis for that salvation. Paul begins with the words, "Blessed be the God and father of our Lord Jesus Christ." It's not that we would ask for blessings but rather that we offer blessings to God. We may want to ask ourselves what would we have to offer God, and that is a very real question. We, who are the created, can we truly bless the creator? Can we offer Him anything in return? Paul lays out then, all that God has done for us, in choosing us, adopting us, redeeming us, and giving to us, that guarantee of our salvation and the fruit of the spirit in us, our faith. It is our faith and that which is within us, placed there by the Holy Spirit, that reassures us that we are truly redeemed and that we stand before God even this day. Because of what Paul says, we should never question whether we have done enough or what more must we do, but rather always say with great confidence, that I know that I am redeemed, because my God had done all the work. As we work through this passage, we'll be looking at some phrases that Paul repeats over and over again. The two phrases we're going to look at are "in Him" and "for the praise of His glory." They seem like little phrases and yet Paul emphasizes them so much. With the "in Him," he indicates to us that when we have trial and when we have tribulation, we need to look to that source of our salvation, Jesus, and "in Him" know what God has already done. Each time "in Him" is used in this passage, Paul brings out another dynamic of our eternal salvation. It is truly beautiful to see what Jesus has done for us and what Jesus grants to us.

On our Wednesday journey, as we look at the death and resurrection accounts in the gospels, we will start by looking at what Jesus' death on the cross does for us, how that death touches us, and changes us from a body of sin to a body of redemption and from a body of death to a body of resurrection. We will then look at Jesus' death on the cross and how him being touched by death did so much for us and created that new Kingdom for us. How his resurrection on Easter morning is so much more than that one event and rather how it changes all of history. We will then look at several individuals who had been touched by physical death and the end seemed to be there, but we will see Jesus step into those situations and turn death into resurrection with his own words and his own actions. In each of these accounts he did it not because of anything the individual could do, rather he did it to God's glory. He did it so that the Kingdom of God would be known. As we see these accounts unfold before us, we can look at the times in our lives when we didn't suffer a physical death, but a death in another way. Perhaps it was a loss of a job. Perhaps it was some other great loss in our life. But Jesus worked through it to raise us up and to give us a new life. What this does for us is it renews in us that hope and that joy that comes with knowing Jesus. It causes us to look beyond the pain and suffering of this world and to focus on the world to come where Jesus will stand with us and present us to the father. Alive and well and united with him.

As we go through these 40 days, and draw closer and closer to that hill of Calvary, may our heart be lifted up by both of these themes and may our lives show forth the glory of God in Jesus Christ.


Kyle Hilgendorf is hosting a car wash, with his team, to raise funds for the 12U baseball tournament in Cooperstown, NY, this summer.


Registrations are Underway! 2025-2026 School Year. We offer small class sizes of only 10 students per classroom!
